I am very pleased with how keen all the children are on the school library. They love the huge variety of books: long novels, short novels, information books on many subjects from Science to Famous People with much in between, cartoon and puzzle books, joke books, funny fact books such as Horrible Histories, poetry (lots of poetry), traditional tales and picture books of course. Books don't just give you answers, they make you ask more questions and it is great that we read about, say, Space and then want to find out even more about it: planets, stars, black holes...This curiosity could lead to a child becoming an astrophysicist...who knows?

My work is all about aspiration: encouraging children to improve their reading skills, absorb information and aim high. Once children have borrowed, they can share a wide range of children's magazines in the library and study encyclopaedias and atlases. This term I am running two clubs to encourage wider reading: Premier League Reading Stars and, for older children, Woolmore Book Award. Please visit the library every Thursday after school with your family and enjoy the wonderful books and space together.
