As you will have seen in the news, a devastating earthquake hit Nepal on Saturday. Children are helpless and terrified as it toppled buildings and destroyed roads and infrastructure around the capital Kathmandu. More than 3000 people are reported to have died and thousands more are trapped in rubble.

Unicef is on the ground, delivering clean water and other life-saving emergency supplies for children and families. One in four of Nepal's population are children and Unicef are urgently assessing their needs. Unicef urgently need our help so they can help more children.

That's why we're holding a Bring-A-Pound Day for Nepal next week. On Wednesday 6th May I am kindly asking that your child brings in a donation of £1, or any small change you can spare, to help Unicef's relief efforts in Nepal.
