READING IS SUCCEEDING

"Overall, young people who enjoy reading very much are nearly five times as likely to read at the expected level for their age compared with young people who do not enjoy reading at all." (*Children's and Young People's Reading Today, 2012*)

In addition, research also shows that:

- Enjoying reading is more important for children's educational success than their parents' socioeconomic status.
- Reading for pleasure has social and emotional benefits it builds empathy.
- Children who are strong readers tend to perform better in maths too.

This term, as a school, we are focussing on developing our children's reading skills and their love of reading. We have lots of different activities planned throughout the term to excite and engage our children and help them build a lifelong reading habit. The Silver Birch library opening by Author Sam Gayton was a great start. Watch this space for more information on reading events such as: World book day (March 3rd), special reading homework tasks, reading workshops for parents and much, much more.

How can you help at home?

Encourage your child to explore and enjoy lots of different types of reading at home: story books, fact books, comics, annuals etc. Take them to the Ideas store to find new books or to read more on the types of things they become interested in. Support your child in finding ways for them to want to read every day at home. There is no short cut to becoming a good reader: they just need to read as often as possible.

Everyone is a reader, some just haven't found their favourite book... yet.
