an animal that eats other animals



whiskers

A whisker is a long, thick hair around the mouth of some animals



herbivore

an animal that eats plants



amphibians are animals that:

- Can live on land or in water.
- Have backbones.



omnivore

an animal that eats other animals and plants



A **mammal** is a type of animal that has hair or fur, breathes air, has a backbone, and feeds its babies with milk.



paws and claws

A paw is the soft foot-like part of a mammal (usually with a claw).



A **reptile** is an airbreathing animal that has scales instead of hair or feathers.




Year 1: Let's Learn About...Paws, Claws and Whiskers!
