Applying for a place at Woolmore School: did you know?

•If you are the parent of a child at Woolmore, you probably want any younger brothers and sisters of that child to come to Woolmore too. If so, you need to apply for a school place.

Pupils usually start primary school in the September after their fourth birthday. Children born between 1st September 2014 and 31st August 2015 should be starting school in September 2019.

Applications are handled by Tower Hamlets Council. For a September 2019 start, applications must be made by 15th January 2019 at the very latest.
