- Find where these castles/palaces are in the UK. Can you put them onto your UK map?
- Find out where the Queen is currently staying now.
- Where are the Crown Jewels kept? (Many of you will have visited them on one of our trips). Which London Borough is this part of? Where is the nearest tube station if you wanted to visit them in the future?
