
Nailing the Basics (Prime Areas of Learning)

- Encourage children to answer 'how' and 'why' questions about their experiences.

- Write, order and count numbers to 20.
- Practice counting in 2's.








Nailing the Basics (Prime Areas of Learning)


- Read daily for at least 15 minutes. Log on to Oxford Owl Share your favourite story with a
 family member.
- Make sure to keep active Joe The Body Coach https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCAxW1XT0iEJo0TYlRfn6rYQ
- Talk, talk and talk when you are at home. Encourage children to use language to tell you narratives/stories. These could be made up stories as well.
- Encourage children to talk about how they feel and how others show feelings.
- Practice letter formation and writing sight words.
- Write, order and count numbers to 20.
- Practice counting in 5's and 10's.
- Phonics keep practicing your letter sounds. See attached sheet.
- Sight words You should know all 45 sight words. Can you spot them in books, newspapers and magazines? See attached sheet for list of sight words.

Maths

Look at the clock. Talk about what you notice.

The numbers that go around the circle, the long hand and the short hand.

When the long hand is on 12 and the short hand is on 1, it is 1 o'clock. What time is it if the long hand is on 12 and the short hand is on 9?





Nailing the Basics (Prime Areas of Learning)

- Practise your number bonds to 10 do you remember the rhyme from the very first home learning pack?



Maths

This week we will learning how to identify half of a shape. When you cut something in half, it will be equal on both sides.

Draw a circle. Can you colour half of the circle? What does your shape look like now?

What will half of a square, rectangle and triangle look like? Shade in half of the shapes to see.

What shape is this? Count the sides to help you figure it out. Can you half this shape?

Nailing the Basics (Prime Areas of Learning)

- Read daily for at least 15 minutes. Log on to Oxford Owl https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/
- Remember to keep washing your hands for as long as it takes to sing happy birthday twice.
 https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/healthy-body/best-way-to-wash-your-hands/
- Make sure to keep active Joe The Body Coach https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCAxW1XT0iEJo0TYIRfn6rYQ
- Talk, talk! When you are at home, talk about all the things you are doing. Ask your child what are they reading? What is the story about? Who are the characters? How does it end? What is your favourite part of the story?
- Encourage children to respond back to you using a full sentence.
- Practise letter formation and have a go at using your sight words to write a sentence (see attached sheets). Don't forget your capital letters, finger spaces and a full-stop at the end.
- Practice writing numbers to 20. Can you start with the number 20 and write them in order backwards? 20, 19, 18......

• Children should have a go at reading independently using sight words and their phonic knowledge to help them. Remember if you are unsure of the words – look at the letters, say the sounds and blend the sounds together. If your child needs help support them.

 describe how quickly or slowly he travelled or the sounds the rocket might make as it travels?
