If I'm with hundreds of people and my name gets called, my sound switches me on to answer like it was my human electricity.


My name echoes across playground, It comes, it demands my attention. I have to find out who calls, who wants me for what.

Our Curriculum

This half term has been an exciting one for our children as we help them develop their skills and 'know more, remember more'. Our curriculum aims to help our children be more curious, collaborative, competent and confident across each of the National Curriculum subjects. We hope your child has been sharing a few of their learning highlights.

P.E.

In **PE**, our Reception and KS1children have been working on developing throwing and catching skills.

KS2 children have worked towards finals this week in basketball (Y3/4) and netball (Y5/6).



Seashells in Art

In **Art** this term, we are working to develop our children's drawing, painting, collage and sculpture skills. Our Y4 children have created their own 'Blue Abysss' artwork in the style of Georgia O'Keefe's seashell paintings.

Thee has been some exciting **design technology** learning this term with Y2 and Y5 designing, making and evaluating their own healthy recipes. Music: Y6 were beating the rhythm with the djembes in the studio today.



Mayan temples in Computing

Our **Computing** learning plays a vital role in helping our children develop key skills for the future. Y6 pupils have been learning how to use TinkerCad - 3D Computer Aided Design technology, using their Ancient Civilisation learning in History to design their own Ancient Mayan Temples.
