



Learning highlights spring term 2014

Here are some of the learning highlights for each class this term.

Nursery

Children in the nursery have loved learning about light and dark and water whilst spending time in their space cave with aliens, stars and torches.



One of their favourite books is 'Ten Little Pirates'. They are also getting really brilliant at phonics and key words.

Reception

Children in Reception have been doing



a lot of travelling this term. On their trip to Greenwich they saw the Cutty Sark (above) and they found out about the moon and the stars at the Observatory.

Their trip to Trafalgar Square included a workshop at the National Portrait Gallery and a visit to Buckingham Palace where the Queen lives. Reception children also love pirates!

Year 1

In Year 1 it has been all about the dinosaurs. Their trip to the Natural History Museum was very exciting as they loved seein



as they loved seeing the enormous models of diplodocus and tyrannosaurus rex. The children have written stories, poems and are now dinosaur experts.

Year 2J and Year 2S

In Year 2 the children have been learning all about the **Great Fire of London**, which started in Pudding Lane in 1666. They have donelots of writing including diary entries just like Samuel Pepys.

Year 2 have also been very active in PE practicing their balances, jumps, rolls and routines.
