#### **Banding**

Your child has been placed in a Band for the purpose of allocating secondary school places. You will receive your child's Band in a letter which your child will bring home this week. You will need this band to complete the eadmissions form.

# How was my child given a band?

Tower Hamlets has a policy of banding with the aim of ensuring that secondary schools take an even balance of pupils in different ability ranges. The band has been determined by reading assessments in Year 5. Children are placed in one of four bands Band A, B, C and D. D indicates the highest attainment band.

### How can I get some help?

For some families this will be first time you have a child going to secondary school. Even if you have done it before it is all a bit different now. We understand that this can be a worrying time and, as always, we are here to help you - to talk, to listen and to support with

completing paperwork. It is also an exciting time as children prepare for the next stage of their education. Please don't hesitate to speak to us:
